Jesus said in Mark 12:29-31 "The most important one, answered Jesus, is this Hear, O Israel, the Lord our God, the Lord is one. If we want to eliminate young people killing each other then we have to go back to the basics of the awesomeness of being of African descent and the beauty of Blackness. We have to teach our children to love who they are by knowing their story.

There will be no true liberation for black people until we coalesce around our Africanity for our common destiny. There will be no political, economic or sociological solutions to our sufferings unless we emphasize our ethnic excellence. We will always feel intimidated by others and what they think. We will have political position and still nominate a white women whose record on hiring minorities is a hot mess instead of any number of qualified Black women, all because we are worried about what others will say.

We begin today by saluting the strength, savviness and sexiness of our Soul Sistahs. We worship God today for Black women. We thank God for blessing us with the Crown of Creation in African women. Like the poem says "A Room full of Sistahs like Jewels in a crown, Cinnamon, coffee and dark chocolate brown." Please make sure you are here for both services and that you are here each night for women's week as we show how much we love us and especially the fine fragrance of Black women's femininity!
